On **Saturday**, **February 1**, all OAPCE Directors attended the OAPCE Board of Directors Meeting in Toronto. The meeting included a virtual blessing and greetings from Bishop Mathieu, who emphasized the importance of spiritual guidance and parental involvement in Catholic education. OAPCE Directors shared regional updates, and the commissioning of new OAPCE Directors for Niagara, London and Dufferin-Peel.

On **February 13, 2025, OAPCE All Regions** meeting took place. The keynote speaker, Dr. Josephine Lombardi, gave an inspiring presentation on *The Jubilee* **Year and Pilgrims of Hope,** encouraging parents to embrace their roles as spiritual leaders and advocates in Catholic education.

Dr. Josephine Lombardi led an insightful session on the Jubilee Year of Hope, exploring its significance in Catholic faith. She discussed the Virtue of Hope, based on St. Paul's teachings, and the importance of joy in enduring difficult times. Dr. Lombardi explained the origins of the Jubilee Year, from its Jewish roots of reconciliation and forgiveness to its establishment in Catholic tradition by Pope Boniface VIII in 1300. She emphasized the importance of confession, indulgences, and the symbolism of the Holy Door as a pilgrimage act. To participate in the Jubilee Year, Dr. Lombardi recommended spiritual practices like fasting, almsgiving, and visiting sacred sites.
