2023 OAPCE Parent Survey

In December 2023, the OAPCE Parent Survey was conducted to gather insights from parents in Catholic education in Ontario. This survey covered a variety of topics, including reasons for enrolling children in Catholic schools, involvement in parent school councils, the importance of OAPCE focus areas, challenges faced by parents, preferences for events and training by OAPCE, specific areas of interest, suggestions for improvement, and opinions on potential Ministry of Education policies.

Parents were asked to provide information on their child's school board, reasons for choosing Catholic education, current participation in parent school councils, the significance of focus areas like student well-being and communication with school boards, and the importance of parental involvement in decision-making. They were also questioned about current challenges, desired actions from OAPCE, event preferences, needed training/resources, and topics of interest for the upcoming year. The survey had 396 respondents and sparked additional emails, meetings and conversations.

Additionally, parents shared their opinions on potential Ministry of Education policies relating to parental rights, cell phone usage in classrooms, and school presentations/speakers, offering feedback and suggestions on these matters.

The findings from the OAPCE Parent Survey will play a crucial role in shaping this paper. This research paper aims to highlight the vital responsibilities and opportunities parents have in shaping their children's education and spiritual growth within the Catholic education system. By recognizing and promoting the pivotal role of parents in education, the survey outcomes will help strengthen the collaboration between home and school, ultimately enhancing the overall development and academic success of students in Ontario's publicly funded Catholic schools.

As the Most Rev. Bishop Mathieu, liaison Bishop to OAPCE stated in his Fall message to parents: "In today's world, this is not an easy mission. Your most important commitment is to continue to invest in your role as first and most influential educators of the children God gave you in his love. It requires from each and every one of us a renewed personal encounter with Christ, the risen Lord. Like any human being, your children's hearts desire God. You are the voice that reminds them on a daily basis that God's love is calling them.

During the annual lobby day at Queen's Park, OAPCE and many partners made a strong impact, underscoring the importance of collaboratively supporting Catholic education. Key stakeholders from the catholic community, highlighted the importance of demonstrating unity and cooperation among all partners in Catholic education to the province's elected officials at Queen's Park.

Representatives from the Ontario English Catholic Teachers Association (OECTA), the Ontario Catholic Schools Trustees' Association (OCSTA), and the Assembly of Catholic Bishops of Ontario (ACBO), collectively known as Friends and Advocates for Catholic Education, spent the day lobbying the province's elected officials. Amid worries about potential education funding reductions and school closures, the importance of backing Catholic education was reaffirmed, with a focus on the significance of empowering parents to choose their child's schooling. OAPCE also participated to ensure that parents had a voice in this crucial advocacy effort.

During recent meetings with various MPPs from all three parties, including Minister of Education Stephen Lecce, there has been a positive response indicating a shared commitment to supporting Catholic education. Minister Lecce has shown his support for Catholic education by engaging with the group during lobby day. It's worth mentioning that as advocates for Catholic education, we work with current political leaders and respect their position and roles while remaining neutral when it comes to politics. Our focus is on championing equitable access to quality education for all students.


